What are your plans after graduating?

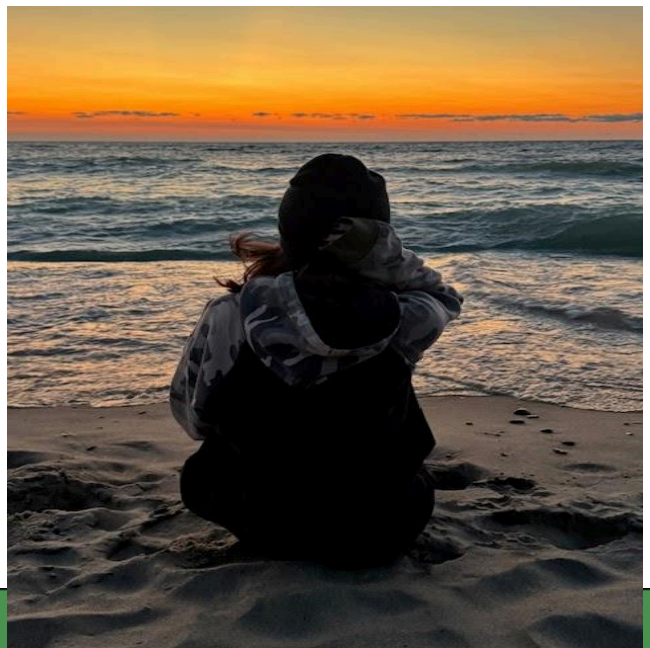
I plan on going to college and I see myself taking care of animals.

Any advice for the students of Casman?

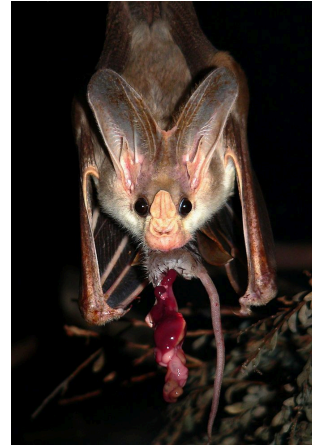
“My advice is, just do your work and stay to yourself. It'll help.”

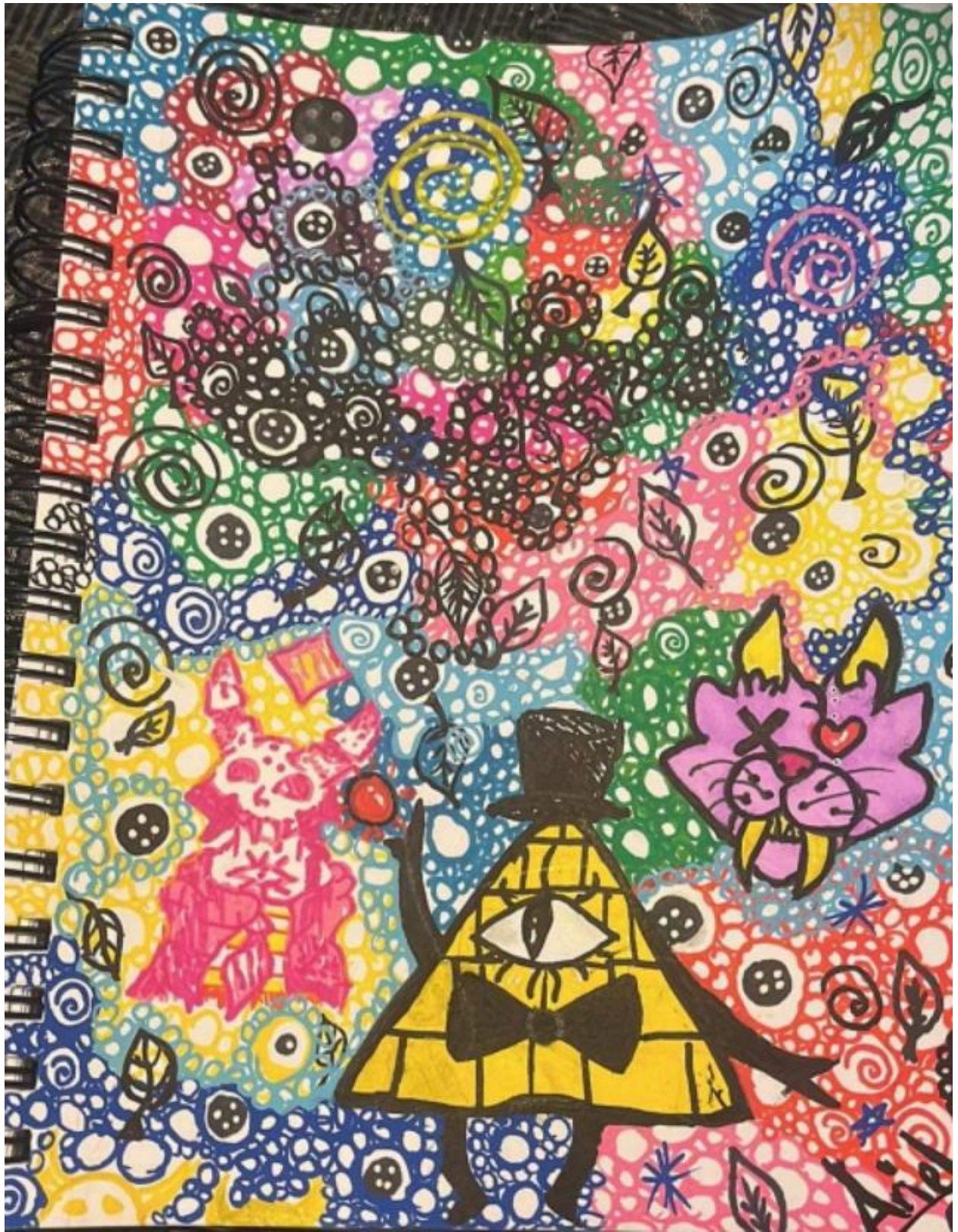

Weekly Story By Nathan Edgington :

The United States invented and manufactured red night vision goggles. Red phosphor night vision goggles were thought to improve troops' ability to transition between day and night vision as they do not require adaptation to low light settings. Red light also activates neurons in the brain, increasing reflex time and spatial awareness, he noted. The new goggles were handed to predominantly airborne troops in 1965, and the entire odd incident lasted around 60 days... A week after receiving the red phosphor night vision goggles, the troops' conduct began to shift. 'The guys began acting oddly, talking about things that no one else could see... they were focused on looking at trees, then they had disciplinary issues and began fighting amongst themselves.' According to Anthony, a critical occurrence occurred during a helicopter patrol over a relatively tranquil area of Vietnam, when a gunner using red night vision goggles opened fire on something at the same altitude as the aircraft. 'The gunner shouted out that he was shooting at demons, and he continued yelling devils,' Anthony recalled, stressing that the things were horrible-looking, had horns, and were flying toward the helicopter. Officers and pilots were instructed not to use the red night vision goggles, but an officer aboard the helicopter directed the gunner to remove his goggles and then put them on himself. 'He noticed six weird winged humanoid beings coming up from the treetops below toward the helicopter.' This wasn't a solitary incident. For weeks, troops wearing red phosphor night vision goggles reported sightings of flying creatures. Officers who broke instructions and donned the red night vision goggles reported seeing gargoyles or demons, and everyone who wore them said the entities would pursue them as soon as they spotted them, he said. The use of the red night vision goggles was abruptly discontinued after 60 days. According to Anthony, soldiers who used the goggles were emotionally disturbed for months thereafter, and the military has subsequently converted to green phosphor night vision goggles.
