Happy Thanksgiving!!

Thanksgiving traces its origins back to the early 17th century when the pilgrims, a group of English settlers, arrived in North America aboard the Mayflower. They landed at Plymouth Rock in present-day Massachusetts in 1620. After a harsh winter where many settlers perished, the surviving Pilgrims received crucial assistance from the Wampanoag tribe, who taught them essential agriculture techniques and helped them adapt to their new environment.

By the fall of 1621, the Pilgrims had successfully harvested their first crops. To celebrate their survival and give thanks for the bountiful harvest, they organized a feast. This event, now known as the first Thanksgiving, was attended by 53 Pilgrims and around 90 Native Americans, including the Wampanoag chief, Massasoit. The feast lasted for three days and featured foods like venison, fowl, and corn, reflecting the resources available to them at the time.

Over the centuries, Thanksgiving evolved into a national holiday in the United States. President Abraham Lincoln proclaimed it a national holiday in 1863, setting it as the last Thursday in November.

Today, Thanksgiving is celebrated with family gatherings, feasts, and traditions such as parades and football games, serving as a time to reflect on gratitude and togetherness.

Animal of the Week: Long-Tailed Duck By Jaden Sherwood

The Long-Tailed Duck is a species of semiaquatic duck in the Anatidae family. These ducks are about 17 - 25 inches and weigh just barely over 1 lb. These ducks can be found in the arctic tundra, and more often than not, near freshwater wetlands. These ducks really only go on land to breed and nest. Even then, they'll stay near water. Even in winter, they'll stay in the water.

Song of the Week: I'm Still Standing-Elton John


