What advice can you give to the people of Casman?

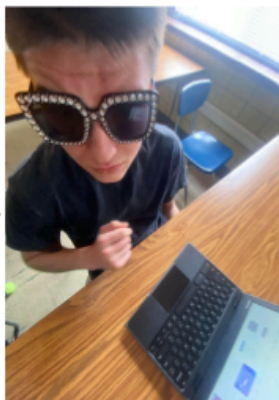
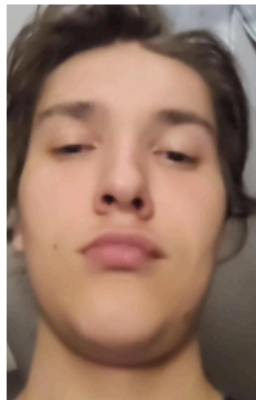
Follow your dreams and do your work!

German Flecktarn – I really like the patterns and use them often.

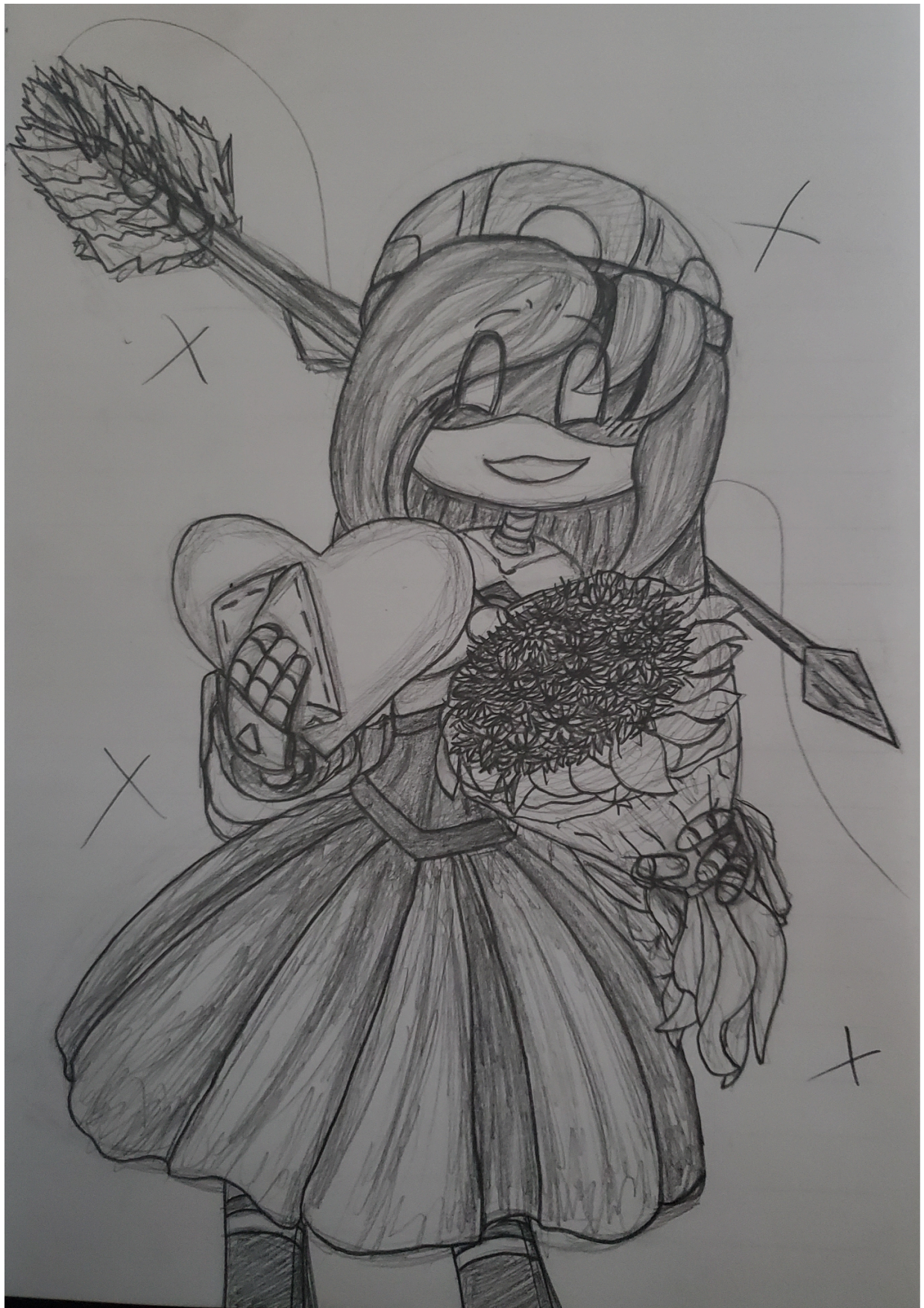
Gear & Equipment:

Insight on My Business: I have bought Insight on my business: I run my business model by trying to give the lowest cost to the customer as I can while still making money for the business itself. I rarely buy singular items to list as the markup would be too high. I have several suppliers from around the world ranging from Vietnam, Lithuania, Ireland, and Germany. With these suppliers, I buy large lots of items with 60% being cheaper items and 40% being expensive items. I do this so that I can bring the Cost per item down by dividing the total lot cost by the number of items. This benefits both the seller and the consumer by letting me have more control over pricing and not making listings over market price and giving the cheapest price I can to the Customer.

Collaboration & Growth: Working with other businesses is key to my success. Supporting other small businesses helps boost sales all around and even though they are competition, if I support other small businesses they are more likely to support me when I do something cool or need help. This mutually beneficial relationship between businesses at least in the social media world is what has caused me to grow so much in the last year
